

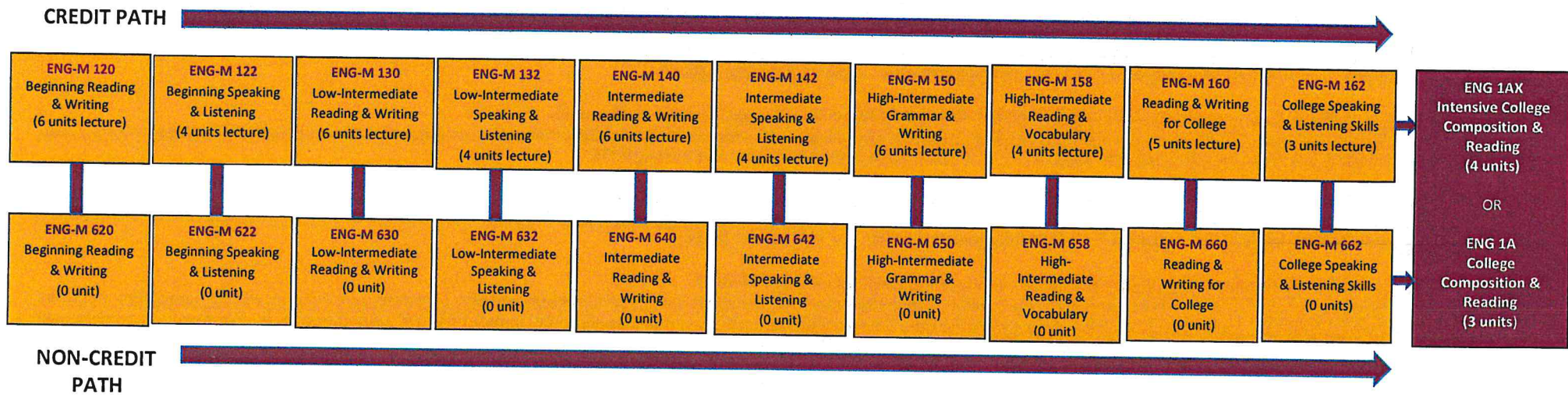

COURSE DESCRIPTIONS

ENGM-120 Beginning Reading and Writing (6 Credits)/ ENGM-620 Beginning Reading and Writing (0 Credits)

Reading and writing practice at the beginning level for multilingual speakers of English. Course includes three weekly hours of lab. Advisory: Students should be literate enough in their native language to write a note to a friend or read a newspaper in their native language. They should have enough English language competency to speak and/or write understandable simple sentences despite making grammatical errors. Requisites: NONE

ENGM-122 Beginning Speaking and Listen (4 Credits)/ ENGM-622 Beginning Speaking and Listen (0 Credits)

Listening and conversation practice at the beginning level for multilingual English learners. Requisites: NONE

ENGM-130 Low-Intermediate Reading & Writing (6 Credits)/ ENGM-630 Low-Intermediate Reading & Writing (0 Credits)

Emphasizes the development of writing, vocabulary, and reading skills for low-intermediate multilingual English learners. Includes three hours/week of lab instruction. Requisites: NONE

ENGM-132 Low-Inter Speaking & Listening (4 Credits)/ ENGM-632 Low-Inter Speaking & Listening (0 Credits)

Listening and conversation practice at the low-intermediate level for multilingual English learners. Requisites: NONE

ENGM-140 Intermediate Reading & Writing (6 Credits)/ ENGM-640 Intermediate Reading & Writing (0 Credits)

Emphasizes grammar, vocabulary and reading comprehension skills for intermediate multilingual English learners. Includes three hours of lab per week. Requisites: NONE

ENGM-142 Intermediate Listening & Speaking (4 Credits)/ ENGM-642 Intermediate Listening & Speaking (0 Credits)

Listening and conversation practice at the intermediate level for multilingual English learners. Requisites: NONE

ENGM-150 High-Intermediate Writing & Grammar (6 Credits)/ ENGM-650 High-Intermediate Writing & Grammar (0 Credits)

Grammar and writing for high-intermediate multilingual English students. Complex sentences, verb tenses, and paragraph writing skills are stressed. Course includes three weekly hours of lab. Not open to students who have completed ESL-255 with a grade of "C" or better. Advisory: ENGM -140. Requisites: NONE

ENGM-158 High-Intermediate Reading & Vocab (4 Credits)/ ENGM-658 High-Intermediate Reading & Vocab (0 Credits)

Uses current issues and nonfiction texts to develop critical reading skills, academic vocabulary, and discussion skills. For multi-lingual English speakers at a high-intermediate level. Not open to students who have completed ESL-258 with a grade of "C" or better. Advisory: ENGM -140. Requisites: NONE

ENGM-160 Reading & Writing for College (5 Credits)/ ENGM-660 Reading & Writing for College (0 Credits)

Prepares students to read and write for college. Readings include college or near college-level articles, essays, and other types of nonfiction. Emphasis on summary writing, paragraphs and short essays that analyze and respond to class readings. Includes practice with vocabulary, grammatical forms, and punctuation that support effective writing in college. Not open to students who have completed ESL-101 with a grade of "C" or better. Advisory: ENGM-150. Requisites: NONE

ENGM-162 College Speak & Listen Skill (3 Credits)/ ENGM-662 College Speak & Listen Skill (0 Credits)

This course develops listening and speaking skills that multilingual students need to succeed in college. These skills include note taking, asking for clarification, summarizing, small group and whole class discussions, and individual and group presentations. Requisites: NONE

ESL-295 English and Spanish in the Community (1.0 Credits)/ENGM-695 English and Spanish in the Community (0 credits)

This course is organized around a partnership between English and Spanish language learners that allows them to develop interpretive, presentational, and interpersonal listening and speaking skills and intercultural communicative competence, through activities, projects, and authentic interactions with speakers of their target language. Advisory: ENGM-130
